There are several areas and properties within Perry Park that need attention with debris and items just standing or laying around and should be removed. Let's all take part to ensure we are "spring cleaning" our area.

KENTUCKY'S "NO BURN SEASON"

The Kentucky's Division of Forestry's "no burn season" ban started on February 15th. In accordance with 401 KAR 63:005 Open Burning, it is against the law to set fire from 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM to any flammable material located within 150 ft of any woodland or brushland. The regulation prohibits the burning of tires, garbage, construction debris, demolition debris, appliances, cars, buses, trailers and all other materials including plastics. With everyone starting to get outside and clean up their yards and branches the wind takes moisture out of the

ground and it's easy to catch fire. Even burning in containers isn't safe this time of year because the wind can blow embers out of the container and cause a grass fire. If burning after 6:00 PM it should only be things that are of natural growth. If you plan to burn before 6:00 AM and after 6:00 PM, call 911 to report a controlled burn. The ban ends April 30th. However, even after that date ALWAYS be safe and cautious. Follow the law and do not burn illegally. Fines of up to \$25,000 per day can be imposed by the KY Division for Air Quality. Throughout the year, Owen County may place a ban on ALL fires if a drought occurs. You will then be notified by Owen County.

I'd like to start out and thank everyone for all of the positive feedback I received for our new addition to the newsletter This and That. Now with that being said I would like to share with you the letter I received in the mail concerning my win at the annual Hand and Foot Tournament that was held this past year the letter reads as follows:

Subject: Complaint final ruling

In early November my office received a complaint regarding impropriety during the 2010 Perry Park-Terre Haute, Hand & Foot tournament.

The complaint stated that the winner Sue Errgang played only home games during the 2010 tournament. Since, she had no away games that she was in violation of section 8, article 4 of the "Hand & Foot tournament handbook".

Also, because she had no away games that gave her an unfair advantage & her "2010 Card Player of the year" title should be withdrawn.

The complaint was turned over to a panel of three judges to ascertain the validity of the complaint. After an exhaustive fact finding inquiry; their conclusions are listed below.

1. At the end of the first session of competition Mrs. Errgang was in last place and down 22,000 points.
2. Playing all games at home in some cases can have disadvantages. In this case we found that the disadvantages we're of the nature of distractions. The main distraction was continually having to wait on her husband hand & foot (no pun intended) during the tournament. This would not be the case during "away" games where the host couple would be responsible for seeing to Mr. Errgang's every and many needs.
3. In summary: Mrs. Errgang coming back from being in last place and at the same time dealing with several constant distractions indicates that she is a skilled Hand and Foot player. In a unanimous vote we feel that Mrs. Errgang gained no unfair advantage and the complaint is without merit. She will retain her "2010 Card Player of the Year" title.

BURN SITE

We are very close to having our burn site privileges taken away from us if we continue the following: 1) Dumping materials not allowed 2) Not putting allowed items directly on or up against the main burn pile 3) Allowing outside companies to use the burn site. The only items allowed are limbs, branches and leaves and only Perry Park residents are allowed this privilege. Contractors such as tree trimmers, builders, re-modelers and constructions companies are not permitted to put anything at the burn site.

Residents are not allowed to give these companies permission to use the burn site. Any contractor or resident allowing contractors to use the site will be responsible for removing the material. If it is not removed the contractor may not be allowed past the Guard Station to work in the future. There are materials presently at the burn site such as rugs, padding, tires, vinyl, plastic, construction material and furniture that must be removed at PPROA's expense. In the case of future violations of these rules every effort will be made to determine who the violators are and they will be held responsible for removing such material. There are EPA regulations against burning much of this material and we are not going to take the chance of being heavily fined.

THIS IS A BURN SITE NOT A GARBAGE / TRASH DUMP!

Rumpke will take most of these not-allowed items. If you don't have trash pickup then ask a neighbor who has pickup if you can put your items with his. You can also take about anything to the Owenton waste facility free of charge on the last Saturday of every month. All other days there is a charge. Hours are 7 AM to 3:30 PM Monday through Saturday, Phone 484-2427. Also when you are taking allowed items to the burn site put them on or up against the main burn pile. Do not put items along the side of the road or half way to the pile. If it is too wet then wait until it dries out. Violators will be held responsible for moving items to the main burn pile. Please obey the rules and help us keep this privilege. All contractors will be given a notice not to use the burn site and this will be policed as construction in the park is being performed.
